

Tamarack Environmental Protection Association Partners with Valley County Sheriff for Turkey or Tickets Program

Donnelly, Idaho, September 29, 2020: The Tamarack Environmental Protection Association (TEPA) and the Valley County Sheriff's Department are pleased to announce the annual "Turkey or Tickets" program will take place again this year from November 15-24.

Every Thanksgiving season since 2015, the TEPA and the Valley County Sherriff's Department have teamed up to provide community engagement and education through the program.

More than 500 turkeys have been handed out since the program started and this year, more than 50 fortunate people will receive a Thanksgiving turkey instead of a ticket when they are stopped by a Valley County Sheriff's deputy. The turkeys were donated by the TEPA, D9 Grocery and Ridley's Family Market.

Now officially known as the Jan West Memorial Turkey or Tickets program, the initiative was renamed in her honor after she lost a courageous battle with brain cancer in 2018. West and TEPA founder Doug Dvorak spearheaded the Turkey or Tickets program with Valley County Sherriff Patty Bolan.

"Jan was very passionate about service and she did everything she could to improve her local community," said Dvorak. "I think this program exemplifies her commitment and hopefully, everyone who gets a turkey instead of a ticket this year will remember to thank her for the program."

"One thing I should point out is that this is not a blanket 'get-out-of-jail-free-card' for the lead footed out there," Dvorak added. "Anything more than five miles an hour over the speed limit will probably still get you an unwanted piece of paper."
